Our trip to the **Drury Lane Theatre** in Oakbrook Terrace on **Thursday, May 22nd** for the **matinee of *Les Misérables*** (bus will leave Center @ 12:00) is almost full. This production, based on Victor Hugo's 1862 novel, follows French ex-convict Jean Valjean's journey as he relies on his faith and strength to help him hold on to both his freedom and his conscience. Comfortable, round-trip coach transportation will be provided from the Center. A box lunch will be provided to enjoy on our trip to the theater. Memorial Day Commemoration

Geneva Township will continue its tradition of observing Memorial Day **Monday, May 26** by placing ceremonial 3' X 5' American flags at each grave in Geneva Township of those killed in defense of our country. To honor those Geneva Township citizens killed in wartime and whose final resting places lay somewhere beyond our township, we will once again erect a 23-flag tribute. The tribute will occur on Memorial Day on the plaza immediately in front and west of the Center. At approximately 6:30 a.m. the Fox River-Geneva American Legion Post 75 Color Guard will perform a 21-gun rifle salute followed by the bugle call Taps. The Center will be open from 6:30 a.m. until 8:00 a.m. on Memorial Day for Township residents who wish to observe this moving tribute. Refreshments will be served in the Center dining room.

NEW Wednesday Afternoon Movies

The Wednesday movies in April were well received. This month we have two movies suggested by a Center member on the schedule. On **Wednesday, May 7 at 1:00** the Center "theater" will showcase *Music and Lyrics* with **Hugh Grant and Drew Barrymore**. In this 2007 romantic comedy, a washed up singer is given a couple of days to compose a chart-topping hit for an aspiring teen sensation. Though he's never written a decent lyric in his life, he sparks with an offbeat younger woman with a flair for words. This PG-13 film has a running time of 1:36 hours. On **Wednesday, May 28th at 1:00** a romantic drama *The Painted Veil* is on the big screen. **Naomi Watts and Edward Norton** star in this movie based on the **Somerset Maugham** book of the same title. A British medical doctor fights a cholera outbreak in a small Chinese village, while also being trapped at home in a loveless marriage to an unfaithful wife. It's rated PG-13 and lasts 2:05 hours.
