Abraham Lincoln National Cemetery

On Oct. 3, 1999, Abraham Lincoln National Cemetery was dedicated as the 117th national cemetery within the Department of Veterans Affairs National Cemetery Administration. It lies in the northwestern area of the former Joliet Army Ammunition Plant and when fully developed, this 982-acre cemetery will provide 400,000 burial spaces. **Eileen Stocking** recently took a tour of the cemetery and on **Monday, November 9 at 10:30 am** she'll provide an overview of the monuments and memorials contained within the grounds and information related to military funeral honors.

Neapolitan Crèche Program

On **Wednesday, Nov. 18 @ 10:00 am** plan to come hear a presentation by the **Art Insights Program of the Art Institute of Chicago** regarding the 18th-century Neapolitan crèche acquired by the Art Institute and first displayed in 2013. One of the very few (another is owned by the Geneva History Center!) and finest examples of such a work outside of Naples, the crèche is an intricate Nativity scene that reflects the vitality and artisanship that the city is still known for. The Art Institute's crèche features over 200 figures—including no less than 50 animals and 41 items of food and drink—all staged in a spectacular Baroque cabinet with a painted backdrop.
