Geneva Park District and Geneva Township Cooperate

Limited to a small parcel within the boundaries of Wheeler Park which is only slightly larger than the building itself, the Geneva Township Offices and Senior Center required additional parking, patio and fire lane space well beyond its boundaries for the construction of those facilities. In a broad agreement that is a model of intergovernmental cooperation, the Township and the Geneva Park District worked together and agreed between themselves to allow the Township to acquire permanent easements from the Park District for the construction, use and maintenance of those facilities. The end result is a beautiful community asset that serves the constituencies of both units of government.

RJA Design Donates Welcoming Interior Design for the Senior Center

After visiting numerous senior centers, a primary goal of the Township Board and the Senior Services Committee was to avoid an institutional appearance and to create a warm, welcoming atmosphere in the proposed Geneva Township Senior Center. Richard Abrahamson readily agreed to donate his and his talented RJA Design Inc. staff's time to make the vision a reality. Richard designed each room with a warmth and character fitting its function. That Abrahamson readily agreed to donate his abundant talent and hundreds of hours of time to make the Geneva Township Office and Senior Center a showcase facility comes as no surprise to those who know him.

Having taken tennis lessons on the courts in Wheeler Park next to the building, Richard always admired its architectural style. But the building needed to be dramatically transformed to be bright and comfortable. After an inspection of the building, Abrahamson knew he had his work cut out for him. First color schemes had to be developed. He wanted it to be comfortable and traditional but not stuffy; to be bright and lively but not boring. He and his staff dug in. With donated fabric and expertise from the internationally known New York fabric firm of Cowtan & Tout, Abrahamson located antiques and high quality furniture for acquisition by the Township. The Township project has been a labor of pride for the last two years for Richard and his staff. It's all about the end result according to Abrahamson. "It's all in the details; that's our expertise; that's what we do. We look at function first and the form flows from that," he said. Countywide Landscaping Inc. Donation Designs and Builds Senior Center Plaza and Patio

Faced with the requirement of installing an asphalt fire lane in the front of the new Senior Center building, the Township Board saw it as an opportunity to create a public plaza by disguising the fire lane by paving it with brick pavers. The low bidder for the project was the award-winning firm of Countywide Landscaping of Elburn, Illinois. After submitting and being awarded the winning proposal, Countywide's owner, Brian Larson, approached the Township with the idea of donating his company's design expertise and substantial labor to create a public plaza in front of the building and a rear patio area behind the building utilizing what he referred to as the "quilting method" of brick paver installation. The end result is the most beautifully designed and brick paved public plaza and patio in the Chicago metropolitan area. The design and colors of the plaza and patio were inspired by the Township's beautiful building and the surrounding park. "It is a project that I am extremely proud of, and it's in a location where everyone can easily see, use and enjoy it," said Larson. All agree that it is a work of art! DON'T MISS THE 6TH ANNUAL FREE FLU SHOT CLINIC

MARK YOUR CALENDER!



Geneva Township is once again sponsoring a free flu shot clinic on Monday, October 8, from 9 a.m. – to 12:00 noon at the Geneva Township Senior Center. Nurses from the Visiting Nurses Association of Fox Valley will administer the shots. Seniors covered by Medicare Part B will have the cost of their flu shot covered by Medicare. Please bring your Medicare card. Geneva Township will cover the cost of the flu shot for any Geneva Township resident 55 years of age or older (identification required) who is not covered by Medicare Part B. For all others the cost of a flu shot is \$25 and the cost of a pneumonia shot is \$35. New this year will be the availability of DTP (diphtheria, tetanus, and pertussis) shots. The cost of DTP shots is \$45. A prescription will be required for any shot other than a flu shot. For those required to pay for their shot(s), payment must be by cash only. Seniors who need transportation to the flu shot clinic should

contact the Township prior to October 1, 2007. As always, free refreshments will be served. The free flu shot clinic is a great place to make new friends or catch up with old ones! If you have questions, please call the Geneva Township Senior Center at 232-3602.


Subscribe to the Geneva Township Well Being Check System for Free!

In response to the last Senior Citizen Survey, more than 400 Geneva Township Seniors indicated that they wanted some type of "well being check" program instituted where someone would check on them by telephone at their homes on a regular basis. In response to this demand, the Township has developed the Geneva Township Well Being Check System. You can subscribe today to receive this valuable service at absolutely no cost.

When you subscribe to the well being check system, the Township will call you on the day(s) and at the time(s) that you request. If you fail to answer your telephone after the number of telephone calls that you prescribed, the Township will automatically alert those family members, friends or neighbors that you have previously designated, to request that they check on your status. The system can also contact emergency personnel if you desire.

Not only is this system attractive to seniors, it is also attractive to the children of seniors who desire to stay abreast of their parent's well being without necessarily being overly obtrusive in their parent's lives. This system has been used by the children of seniors who reside out of state to keep abreast of their parent's well being from across the country. It's simple, it's effective and it's free to Geneva Township senior citizens. Subscribe today by calling the Senior Center (232-3602) for an appointment.

Participate at No Cost in the Geneva Township Vial Of Life Program!



Communities across the country, including neighboring St. Charles and Batavia, have launched the Vial of Life program which provides pre-printed forms to record vital medical and health information that is intended to assist emergency medical personnel who are administering emergency medical care to seniors in their homes. Current prescriptions, doctor's names, phone numbers, allergies and other medical conditions are examples of information that are included on the Vial of Life form. Participants receive a vial that is used to store the form in the resident's refrigerator. A special refrigerator magnet is placed on the refrigerator door identifying the resident as a Vial of Life program participant. When emergency medical personnel enter your home, they then go into your refrigerator to retrieve your important medical information. Your private

medical information never leaves your possession until it is needed by emergency personnel. Participation in this program is free to all Geneva Township resident seniors 55 years of age or older. Get your Vial of Life packet today at the Geneva Township Senior Center.

TOWNSHIP ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS

Geneva Township's financial assistance programs are available to assist township residents who are finding it difficult to meet basic expenses like medical prescriptions, rent, food and utilities due to unemployment, medical crisis or other circumstances. Qualified township residents may apply for either emergency or general assistance. A completed application and interview are required. Included below is a description of these two programs that often help individuals who may not qualify for aid under state or federal programs and in many instances have only short-term needs.

Emergency Assistance

Emergency assistance may be provided to township

residents only once in a twelve-month period to alleviate a sudden, urgent and unforeseen crisis or combination of circumstances that threaten your physical well being or continued employment.

General Assistance

Unlike emergency assistance, General Assistance is a monthly grant program designed to meet basic needs. Eligibility is determined by a number of financial and non-financial factors. Applicants who qualify for state public aid or social security disability are not eligible to receive General Assistance.

HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT CONTINUES MONTHLY BRUSH PICK-UP

Highway Department staff is continuing to collect brush, weather permitting, on the second Tuesday of the month (April-October) for residents of unincorporated Geneva Township.

Brush is defined as trimmings from bushes or shrubs and trees. Limbs must not be larger than 4 inches in diameter or 10 feet in length. Small twigs and thorny branches should be separated from larger branches. Cut ends should face the road. Residents or contractors who are clearing a lot may not use the brush program.

Logs, stumps, grass clippings and lumber are not considered brush and will not be picked up. Also, the Township will not pick up bags with leaves, sticks or other material. Geneva Township will collect leaves at curbside in the fall.

Remaining pick-ups are scheduled for September 11 and October 9. Any questions can be directed to the Highway Department at 232-3600.
